

I used Mosby's Oncology Nursing Advisor for my Continuing Education Units. In reading this text book I was impressed with the amount of information is in this heavy book. It is great for an overview of a variety of cancers and the many drugs that are used to treat them.

The kindle version of this book is a waste of money. It's full of these grey boxes that says that the media isn't available in the digital format. The text refers to the charts. I read the first few chapters and found it frustrating to know I paid \$44 for a book with a large chunk of the information missing.

We used this text for "Quick Study" of individual cancers and everyone loved its organized and thorough approach. I have recommended this text to many nurses.

I think it is a good resource for the OCN exam, but it is published in 2008. Found a couple of glaring errors which is now making me nervous about the fact checking. On page 26, "Although basal cell carcinoma is fairly infrequent, it is an aggressive disease and accounts for most skin cancer deaths." And in page 27, under Epstein-Barr virus it doesn't mention Burkitt's Lymphoma as a disease.

This was so helpful with my chemo certification test! Very easy to find the things you need & is laid out in a logical format. I would recommend this book to anyone going into any area of oncology!

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
