The glowing reviews convinced me that, despite having never read any of the author's previous novels, this book was a safe bet. I've enjoyed the works of Brad Taylor, Vince Flynn, and Mark Greaney, and "Code Name: Camelot" seemed to follow a similar path, that of highly-trained men and women working for shadowy sectors of the intelligence community, doing the dirty work necessary to protect America. And while the book shows promise, it does not, unfortunately, measure up to the best in the genre. Major spoilers ahead. Facing execution after a mission goes horribly wrong, soldier Noah Wolf is tapped to join a super-secret assassination squad. What makes him special is that Noah suffers from a severe case of PTSD which leaves him emotionless. Like The Terminator, he does not feel pity, remorse, or fear. He will not question orders, struggle with self-doubt, or hesitate to pull the trigger on whoever he is sent to eliminate. In short, he is the perfect killer. Much like Jeff Lindsay's Dexter Morgan, Noah has studied human behavior well enough to fake his way through most social situations, and is given a support team with whom he must learn how to work and bond. The best parts of the book take place here, as the two men and one woman assigned to Noah try to come to grips with having a leader who's more like a machine than a man. Being that this is the first entry in a series, it is inevitable that problems exist. While the idea of a robot-like hero was intriguing enough to draw me in, the novelty quickly wore off once I realized that he had no more facets of his personality left to reveal. He is largely reduced to a toy action-figure, being moved from place to place and doing what the plot requires of him.

Just a great read. Spoiler alert. This one starts with a gringo in a Mexican bar in Juarez, Mexico. The gringo is blond, tall and seems to have lots of money. John Baker is his name. Since a small bottle of Bud costs fifteen bucks the bartender isn't worried about a gringo in his bar. The gringo's money is good. Of course this is the end of the story. Not the beginning. Noah Foster is a soldier in the army and he currently in Afghanistan. He's been an exemplary soldier for the five years he's been in the Army. He's a Special Forces Sgt and has been in the sandbox multiple times. Right now he's being court marshaled for murder. Noah did kill his commanding officer, an Lt., and some of the men in his

unit. His reasoning was simple. They raped and murdered five native girls and wanted him to join in. He made it clear to his Lt. and the men that he wouldn't be joining them but would turn them all in. That's when they tried to kill him. Of course he was better than all of them and the first thing he did was shoot his Lt. in the head. Kill the leader and the rest should surrender. This time that didn't work. The others did their best to kill him and he killed a few of them before the others surrendered. Noah took them all back to the rear, made his report and was promptly arrested for murder. Seems his Lt. was the son of a US Congressmen. A Congressman on the fast track to the White House. Noah's conviction was a done deal. His attorney, JAG Second Lt. Abigail Mathers went to see Noah. She looked him in the eye as he told his story and she believed him. The men with Noah told a completely different story and of course they stuck together. If they hadn't they would be the ones on trial for murder.
